

DESCRIPTION

Sri Lanka (Population: 20 million/ Area: 660,000 km2) heavily depends on imported oil, which supports 45% of primary energy sources and 62% of electric power as well. Therefore, electricity prices are much higher than those of neighboring countries. Sri Lanka is vulnerable in terms of stable energy supply and oil price hikes.



In such situation, to realize sustainable measures for EE&C, the Government of Sri Lanka requested technical cooperation to the Japanese Government. To correspond to this proposal of Sri Lanka, 'the Project Promoting Energy Efficiency Improvement in Sri Lanka' was conducted from 2008 - 2011 under the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA).
